# **Job Description**

### JOB TITLE: Emergency Medical Services Chief

### FLSA STATUS: Full-Time / Exempt

## DEPARTMENT: County Administration/Rescue Squad

**JOB SUMMARY:** Performs complex administrative, technical and planning work in the development and administration of a comprehensive Emergency Medical Services (EMS) program. Develops procedures, rules, and regulations for administration of EMS to coincide with state and federal plans.

#### JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Oversee the administration of the EMS Program, along with related training. Will supervise employees to include prioritizing and assigning work; conducting performance evaluations; ensuring staff are trained and developed, and making hiring, termination and disciplinary recommendations.
- 2. Ensure 24-hour EMS coverage for the County.
- 3. Oversee the assigned budget for the department. Also, develop a budget.
- 4. Report to the Rescue Squad Board monthly.
- 5. Maintain awareness of transport billing status and generated revenue from transport billing by assigning, supervising, competing and assessing billing practices, policies and procedures.
- 6. Manage field operational staff and the day-to-day operations.
- 7. Maintain extensive knowledge of emergency medical care and advanced life support techniques and equipment.
- 8. Maintain patient care records and other documentation as required according to local, state, and federal policies and procedures.
- 9. Designate staff for field preceptor or field training officer roles for new employees.
- 10. Monitor the status of the County's EMS system and assist in coordinating resource allocations.
- 11. Implement and utilize the ICS system as necessary while assuming the most appropriate role.
- 12. Serve as the department liaison to neighboring EMS agencies and jurisdictions; hospitals; skilled nursing facilities; the Virginia Office of EMS; and other key stakeholders.
- 13. Coordinate agency training and education activities to maintain mastery of skills and competence in the delivery of patient care, including annual oral boards with the operational medical director.
- 14. Provide emergency response on a 24-hour basis for major incidents and coordinate on-call supervisor scheduling with the department leadership team.
- 15. Respond to questions, complaints, and requests for information by telephone, e-mail, or in person from news media, merchants, community and civic organizations, the public, attorneys, and county administration.
- 16. Ensure compliance with of department pharmacy with Virginia Board of Pharmacy regulations.
- 17. Maintain inventory of supplies, forms, equipment and ensure availability of adequate resources to carry out daily operations.
- 18. Develop initiatives to foster and promote recruitment and retention for both volunteer and career personnel.
- 19. Participate in EMS-related public health initiatives for schools, community organizations, or other entities as assigned.
- 20. Utilize radio and digital communication platforms in daily operations with appropriate communication discipline.

- 21. Must adhere to all Bland County Emergency Services policies and procedures.
- 22. All other duties as assigned.

#### KNOWLEDGE SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- 1. Relevant equipment, policies, procedures, and strategies to promote effective local, state, or national security operations for the protection of people, data, property and institutions.
- 2. Possess knowledge of Virginia Office of EMS regulations.
- 3. Administrative and clerical procedures and systems such as word processing, managing files and records, designing forms and other office procedures and terminology.
- 4. Ability to handle stress effectively without performance interference.
- 5. Organize, set priorities, and exercise sound independent judgment within areas of responsibility.
- 6. Communicate clearly and effectively, both orally and in writing with staff, patients and others.
- 7. Knowledge of emergency medical care and advanced life support techniques and equipment.
- 8. Acknowledge the risk of exposure to bloodborne pathogens, hazardous materials and substances to self and others.
- 9. Familiarity with the geographical layout of Bland County.
- 10. Ability to manage major emergency medical services incidents and make timely, appropriate decisions regarding patient care.

#### EDUCATION / CERTIFICATION / ACCEPTABLE EXPERIENCE

Associate degree or higher in a related field and extensive experience in the field of Fire and EMS or any equivalent combination of education and experience. Current National Registry and Virginia EMT-Paramedic certifications preferred.

Two (2) years Minimum EMS Experience with supervisory management preferred.
